We're pleased to provide to you this year's Annual Water Quality Report. We want to keep you informed about the quality of water and services we deliver to you every day. This year's report shows no violations. Our source water assessment is currently being conducted and is not available at this time. As soon as it is completed you will be notified and copies of this assessment will be provided.

We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water source is ground water and our two wells draw from the Middle Wilcox aquifer. If you have any questions about this report or concerning your water utility, please contact **Annie Mae Wilson (662 237 4600)** or **Mr. Galen Shumaker (601 416 7402)**. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly schedule meetings, held on the first Tuesday of each month at the Water Department in Carrollton.

**The Town of Carrollton** routinely monitors for contaminants in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This tables show the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31, 2009. As water travels over the land or underground, it can pick up substances or contaminants such as microbes, inorganic and organic chemicals, and radioactive substances. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contact at least small amounts of some constituents. It's important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk.

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Carrollton Water Association is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead>. The Mississippi State Department of Health Public Health Laboratory offers lead testing for \$10 per sample. Please contact 601 576 7582 if you wish to have your water tested.
