**Perry spoke at Waynesburg University graduation**

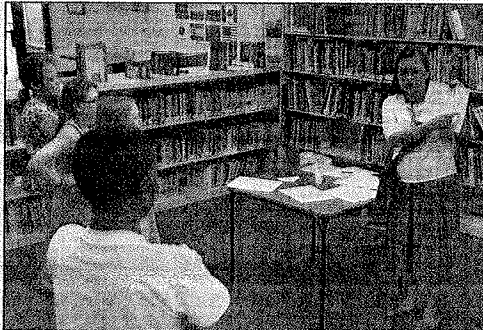
