

We constantly monitor for various constituents in the water supply to meet all regulatory requirements. This past year we failed to collect to correct number of samples required for chlorine monitoring during the sampling periods of 01/01/10 to 03/31/10 and 07/01/10 to 09/30/10.

Significant Deficiencies

During a sanitary survey conducted on 6/23/2010, the Mississippi Department of Health cited the following significant deficiencies:

- 1) Inadequate application of treatment chemicals and techniques (Primary MCLs)
- 2) Unprotected cross connections
- 3) Inadequate security measures

Corrective Actions:

- 1) The backflow preventer on the fluoride feeder has been reinstalled correctly. All deficiencies are scheduled to be completed by 2/15/2011.
- 2) The system has submitted updated test results on all required backflow preventers. All deficiencies are scheduled to be completed by 11/16/2010.
- 3) The system has completed installing additional footage to fences to meet the Mississippi State Department of Health security requirements. All deficiencies are scheduled to be completed by 11/16/2010.

To comply with the "Regulation Governing Fluoridation of Community Water Supplies", the City of Belzoni is required to report certain results pertaining to fluoridation of your water system. Based on the samples submitted, the number of months in the previous calendar year that average fluoride samples were within the optimal range of 0.7 - 1.3 ppm was 12. The percentage of fluoride samples collected in the previous year that was within the optimal range of 0.7 - 1.3 ppm was 96%. Due to clerical errors by the sample collector(s) the samples were improperly categorized for all months in 2010.

Additional Information for Lead

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Belzoni is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested.
