Is my water safe?

We are pleased to present this year's Annual Water Quality Report (Consumer Confidence Report) as required by the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA). This report is designed to provide details about where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to standards set by regulatory agencies.

Do I need to take special precautions?

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Where does my water come from?

Our water source is from wells drawing from the McShan Formation and Gordo Formation Aquifers.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk.

Special monitoring requirements violations

A MESSAGE FROM MSDH CONCERNING RADIOLOGICAL SAMPLING: In accordance with the Radiocesium Rules, all community public water supplies were required to sample quarterly for radiocesiums beginning January 2007.
