We're very pleased to provide you with this year's Annual Water Quality Report. We want to keep you informed about the quality of the water you drink in Spout Springs. Our goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. Our water source is three wells which draw from the Ocala Sand Aquifer.

The report is divided into two sections. The first section provides information on the overall quality of the drinking water supply to Spout Springs. The second section provides information on the quality of the water supply to each well of the system. A report containing detailed information on the quality of the water supply to each well is available for viewing upon request. The wells for the Spout Springs Water Association have been tested and found to be in compliance with all federal and state requirements.

If you have any questions, please contact a water sampling or annual delivery of August, 2014 at the Spout Springs Community Center. The sampling will be held at 6:00 P.M.

The Spout Springs Water Association routinely monitors for contaminants in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2013. As water travels over the land or underground, it can pick up substances or contaminants such as pesticides, herbicides and organic chemicals, and radioactive substances. All drinking water containing these substances may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of these substances. It is important to remember that the presence of these substances does not automatically pose a health risk.

Action Level - the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) - A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) - The "Maximum Allowable" (MCL) is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLG as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal - The "Good" (MCLG) is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Lead	ppb	2013	0.1	1.0	Lead is not a naturally occurring substance in water. It is a byproduct of lead pipes and lead solder.
Radon	dpm/l	2013	10	10	Radon is a naturally occurring gas that can be found in water. It is a byproduct of the decay of uranium and thorium.
Iron	mg/L	2013	0.5	0.3	Iron is a naturally occurring mineral in water. It can cause staining and taste problems.
Copper	mg/L	2013	0.1	1.3	Copper is a naturally occurring mineral in water. It can cause staining and taste problems.
Calcium	mg/L	2013	100	175	Calcium is a naturally occurring mineral in water. It is a major component of water hardness.
