## JP HUDSON NEEDS A CHANGE!

The sexism and racism of JP Hudson Park is both disturbing and unacceptable. The discrimination that I have experienced has no place in modern society. I have been a coach at this park for three years. In 2013 I led a six and under team that was undefeated all the way to state. We brought home the title to every tournament in which we competed including our biggest victory of being World Series champions! That is quite an accomplishment which requires both talented players and coaches, and sadly the treatment I received afterward was nothing like I would have expected. Instead of park leadership being proud for me and my girls, it became obvious that they were not happy for our success. This year I tried to hold my head high and pick another winning team in hopes of another World Series championship title. I did not know until later that I had other people at JP conspiring against me and unfortunately against the young girls on my team because of my success as a female coach. I suspected it in my years past, but it was obvious as the events of this season began to unfold.

This year I had the number one team again at JP and not one of my girls was voted on the All-star team. One of my players was named MVP in the world last year and she did not even make it! This is nothing short of jealousy at its worst which only hurts the innocent children. I eventually found out that this was coming directly from the park leadership and no one would stand up to him. A man was selected, but he stepped down after already calling all of his players first to tell them they made the team, and then calling again the next day to say he was stepping down. This must have been confusing for the families involved. He had three votes and I had received two votes. Instead of the job being offered to me next so everything could move along, the board members were confused when a meeting was called to discuss what to do. I was told I was being "seriously considered for the job" which should have been mine automatically since I had the next highest amount of votes. The park leadership then pushed for the original coach to come back and tell the parents "he didn't take the position there would be no All-star team for their girls. That was never approved by the board, and of course it was a he since there were other coaches in line, including myself, that would have taken the position.

I soon realized that the issues there at JP Park went far beyond just jealousy or sexism when the park leadership personally asked me to cut my talented assistant coach if I wanted a chance at the head coach job. I have coached with her for two years and we made Batesville proud by being state and world champions together. I stood up for what I believed was right and told him I could not accept the position if I had to cut my assistant coach who deserved to be there. He then proceeded to tell me that it was "my choice" and he let the other coach step back in as the head coach. I believe people should be chosen based on talent and work ethic, and not the color of their skin or gender. Unfortunately that is not what happens at JP Hudson Park, and in fact there have been similar cases in the past where no one would ever stand up to the leadership and call for a change.

It is so sad that although JP Hudson Park is supposed to be a stepping stone for the children in our town, it has turned into a racial and gender conflict. That is why I am telling my experiences as a woman who has been involved with this park. I have many witnesses that women and certain African Americans are treated unequally. I am certain that Batesville does not want to continue to let our children be influenced by this racial and gender discrimination. I want my own young daughter to grow up in a healthy and supportive environment for everyone, so for her and all of the other women out there of any color I will be the first voice to speak up and say it is an embarrassment to this town. Our children and our community deserve better.

We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a reliable and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water source is two wells, drawing from the Tallahatta Formation Aquifer.

Our source water assessment has been completed for our public water system to determine the overall susceptibility of its drinking water supply to identify potential sources of contamination. A report containing detailed information on how the susceptibility determinations were made has been furnished to our public water system and is available for viewing upon request. The wells have received a moderate susceptibility ranking.

This report shows our water quality and what it means.

If you have any questions about this report or concerning your water utility, please contact Donald Phelps at 669-3637. We want our valued customers to be informed about their water utility. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly scheduled meetings. They are held on first Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Mt. Olivet Fire Department.

Mt. Olivet Water Association Water System routinely monitors for constituents in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2013. As water travels over the land or underground, it can pick up substances or contaminants such as microbes, inorganic and organic chemicals, and radioactive substances. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It is important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk.

In this table you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions:

**Action Level** - The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

**Treatment Technique (TT)** - A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

**Maximum Contaminant Level** - The "Maximum Allowed" (MCL) is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

**Maximum Contaminant Level Goal** - The "Goal" (MCLG) is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

**Parts per million (ppm)** - Milligrams per liter (mg/L)

**Parts per billion (ppb)** - Micrograms per liter (µg/L)

Olivet Water Association is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested.
