ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. The Child Care Licensure Division would like to welcome our new Licensing Official in District VI, Brittney Robinson. We would also like to bid a fond farewell to Cynthia Lesure from District III, Fallon Brewster & LaRonda Canada from District V and Marshall Dixon from District VIII.
2. The next Child Care Advisory Council Meeting is scheduled for April 26, 2013 at 1:00 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Child Care Licensing Central Office located at 143B Lefleurs Square, Jackson, MS 39211.
3. The proposed amendments to the child care licensing regulations that are scheduled to go before the Mississippi Board of Health (BOH) for approval are posted in the Child Care Licensure section of the Mississippi State Department of Health website located at http://msdh.ms.gov/msdhsite/_static/30,0,183,88.html. The BOH will meet in the MSDH Osborne Building Auditorium located at 570 E. Woodrow Wilson Blvd., Jackson, MS 39215 at 10:00 a.m., on April 10, 2013.

The Oral Proceeding to hear public comments regarding the proposed regulation amendments is scheduled for 11:00 a.m., on April 5, 2013, in the MSDH Osborne Building Auditorium located at 570 E. Woodrow Wilson Blvd., Jackson, MS 39215.

4. The Child Care Licensure Training Unit wishes to remind providers to check the calendars and sign up for classes more than 1 week prior to the training (not the day before or the day of), as your trainers need this information to properly prepare for the class. Training classes/schedules are posted on the MSDH website at http://msdh.ms.gov/msdhsite/_static/30,0,183,437.html.
 - a. The location of the trainings is provided in the confirmation letter which is emailed (or mailed if no email address is provided) to the provider **after** registration.
 - b. If you are attending trainings in an area unfamiliar to you, please allow extra time to find the training location. Registrants who arrive more than **15 minutes** after a class has started WILL NOT receive a certificate for the class even if they stay for the remainder of that class.
 - c. **Non-mandatory trainings are now being offered. Please see the attached calendar for more details!**
5. **PLEASE NOTE:** Effective immediately, the following procedures will be followed concerning payments made to the Child Care Licensure Division:
 - a. **“CASH”** is no longer accepted for payments for regulation books, monetary penalties, application fees, initial licensing fees, renewal fees, late fees, etc.
 - b. All payments to MSDH/Child Care are to be made by Personal Check, Company Check, Certified Check, or Money Order.
 - c. Checks and money orders should be made payable to Mississippi State Department of Health or MSDH.
 - d. Should a personal check or company check be returned to MSDH for “insufficient funds,” a \$50 returned check fee will be assessed. Should such occur, only certified checks or money orders will be accepted from a facility henceforth.
6. **Federal Regulations** mandate that, effective December 28, 2012, Drop Side baby cribs can no longer be used in child care facilities.
7. As a reminder, the Child Abuse Reporting Law states, “Any attorney, physician, dentist, intern, resident, nurse, psychologist, social worker, **child care giver**, minister, law enforcement officer, public or private school employee or any other person having reasonable cause to suspect that a child is a neglected child or an abused child shall cause an oral report to be made immediately by telephone or otherwise and followed as soon thereafter as possible by a report in writing to the Department of Human Services.”

8. If you are interested in becoming approved to offer contact hours to child care providers, the document, ***“How to Become An Approved Staff Development Trainer”*** has been placed on the MSDH website under the “Child Care Provider Training” section and then beneath “Related Resources.” For additional information, please contact Ms. Nancy Nunley, Region 1 Trainer.
9. The Child Care Licensure Division has collaborated with the Office of Tobacco Control to promote the new ***Care for Their Air*** program. This program is geared toward educating child care providers, preschoolers, and their parents about the dangers of second-hand smoke. One contact hour will be available for providers trained by the MS Tobacco-Free Coalition (MTFC) Director in your county (www.tobaccofreems.org). 10. An application fee of \$100.00 must be paid when applying for a new license. For regular annual license renewal, please send only the renewal fee that is based on the capacity of your center.

Child Care Regulations Training will now be credited at 4 Contact Hours instead of 6 Contact Hours.


- Child Care Regulations classes through July 2013 will continue to be credited at 6 Contact Hours.

SUBJECT: **Change of Policy Regarding All Money Sent to Child Care**

EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

There has been a change in policy regarding where to send all payments for Monetary Penalties, Initial Application Fees, Renewal Fees, Regulation Books, etc. Starting immediately, all payments of money, i.e., checks and money orders (*do not* send cash) are to be sent directly to the Child Care Licensure Division in Jackson, Mississippi.

The Department recommends that providers place a note with the payment (check or money order) regarding why you are making the payment. Also, contact your licensing official, by phone or email, and inform them of the reason for the payment and the amount that you are sending to the Child Care Licensure Division in Jackson.

Child Care Providers

Your Guide to New Crib Standards

Beginning **December 28, 2012**, any crib provided by child care facilities and family child care homes must meet new and improved federal safety standards. The new standards take effect for manufacturers, retailers, importers and distributors on **June 28, 2011**, addressing deadly hazards previously seen with traditional drop-side rails, requiring more durable hardware and parts and mandating more rigorous testing.

What you should know...

- This is more than a drop side issue. Immobilizing your current crib will not make it compliant.
- You cannot determine compliance by looking at the product.
- The new standards apply to all full-size and non full-size cribs including wood, metal and stackable cribs.
- If you purchase a crib prior to the June 28, 2011 effective date and you are unsure it meets the new federal standard, CPSC recommends that you verify the crib meets the standard by asking for proof.
 - o Ask the manufacturer, retailer, importer or distributor to show a Certificate of Compliance. The document must:
 - Describe the product
 - Give name, full mailing address and telephone number for importer or domestic manufacturer
 - Identify the rule for which it complies (16 CFR 1219 or 1220)
 - Give name, full mailing address, email address and telephone number for the records keeper and location of testing lab
 - Give date and location of manufacture and testing
 - o The crib must also have a label attached with the date of manufacture

What you should do...

- All child care facilities, family child care homes, and places of public accommodation:
 - o Must prepare to replace their current cribs with new, compliant cribs before December 28, 2012.
 - o Should not resell, donate or give away a crib that does not meet the new crib standards.
- Dispose of older, noncompliant cribs in a manner that the cribs cannot be reassembled and used.
- Noncompliant cribs should not be resold through online auction sites or donated to local thrift stores. CPSC recommends disassembling the crib before discarding it.

KEEP BABY SAFE IN PLAY YARD SPACE

Starting February 28, 2013, testing for play yards will be more rigorous.
Play yards that meet new safety standards must have:

Side rails that resist forming a sharp V when folded to prevent strangulation

Stronger corner brackets to prevent sharp-edged cracks and side rail collapse

Sturdier mattress attachments to the play yard floor to prevent entrapments and injuries

SAFE SLEEP TIPS:

- Always place baby on back to sleep.
- Only use the mattress sold with the play yard.
- Keep pillows, quilts, comforters, and cushions out of play yards, cribs, and bassinets.
- Dress baby in footed pajamas for warmth.

A play yard is a framed enclosure with a floor and mesh or fabric side panels. It may be folded for storage or travel. It is primarily intended to provide a play or sleeping environment for children who are less than 35 inches tall who cannot climb out of the product.

CHILD CARE ADVISORY COUNCIL VACANCIES

The Mississippi State Department of Health, Child Care Facilities Licensure Division has two (2) upcoming vacancies on the Child Care Advisory Council. We are now taking applications from those individuals that would like to serve on the council. All terms are for three years and the selected individuals will be eligible for reappointment to the Council at that time.

The purpose of the Child Care Advisory Council is to assist and advise the licensing agency in the development of regulations governing the licensure and regulation of child care facilities.

Council members are required to attend meetings at least four (4) times a year and more often if necessary. The Department reimburses the council members for their travel according to the rates established by state law.

Individuals eligible to serve on the Council must either be:

1. **Provider** - A licensed child care provider, i.e., either an owner of a licensed child care facility or an employee of licensed child care facility. Documentation of ownership or employment is required.
2. **Professional Organization** - A person officially representing a child care professional organization, child advocacy group, or a state agency that provides child care funding or services. The entity the individual wants to represent must officially nominate them in writing to serve on the Council.

The vacancies that are available in each of the Supreme Court Districts are listed below. See enclosed:

1. Supreme Court District 2 - One Vacancy – Provider
2. Supreme Court District 3 - One Vacancy - Professional Organization

To be considered for appointment to the Council, you must apply in the following manner.

1. Complete the enclosed *Child Care Advisory Council Application* form.
2. Prepare a cover letter explaining why you want to serve on the Council.
3. Prepare a resume.
4. If you are applying for a Professional vacancy, you must submit with your application a letter of nomination from the organization you want to represent.



★ 15-Passenger Vans

***Follow these safety precautions if you own
or ride in a 15-passenger van***

The grim facts

- Between 1994 and 2004, there were 1,512 fatal crashes involving 15-passenger vans.
- A total of 642 of these were single-vehicle crashes; 515 of the vehicles rolled over.
- In 2004 alone, 120 occupants of 15-passenger vans died in crashes involving these vehicles.
- More than half of the 15-passenger vans involved in single-vehicle accidents rolled over, compared to one-third of passenger cars.
- Eighty-one percent of crash-related occupant deaths in 15-passenger vans occur in single-vehicle rollover accidents.

The problems

- Large vans are frequently used to transport college and other school sports teams, commuters, students, day care children, the elderly, and church groups.
- A major problem with 15-passenger vans is that their tires are often underinflated, leading to higher tire temperatures, faster tire deterioration, and diminished driving stability.
- Adding passengers and cargo causes the center of gravity to move upward and rearward, increasing a vehicle's tendency to roll over and increasing the potential for the driver to lose control in emergency maneuvers.
- Fifteen-passenger vans are 3 times more likely to roll over when loaded with more than 10 passengers.
- In just two 15-passenger van crashes alone, in North Carolina and Texas in 2001, a teenager and four senior citizens died when left rear tires failed, the drivers lost control of the vehicles, and the vans rolled over several times.

What can you do to make a trip in a 15-passenger van safer?

- Beware! Front and back tires may require different inflation pressures and these pressures may be higher than those of passenger car tires. Car tire pressures are typically **28-32 lbs.** and the same for all 4 tires. However, van tires are **very different** with typically up to **50 lbs.** in the front tires and up to **80 lbs.** in the rear tires. The manufacturer's recommended pressure is usually provided on the driver's doorsill or in the owner's manual.

- Always check the conditions of the tires. Examine tires for uneven wear, cracks, and damage, and replace them if necessary. Many of these 15-passenger vans are not continuously driven like a family car. Exposure to sunlight and sitting parked for long periods can lead to deadly tire degradation and dry rot.
- It is critical to remember that low mileage doesn't mean tires are safe. Unfortunately, dangerously deteriorated tires cannot always be detected by visual inspection alone.
- Wear seat belts! Keep all seat belts accessible and require that all passengers use them. NTSB accident investigations show that several of the van passengers who died might not have lost their lives if they had been wearing seat belts. They were ejected from the 15-passenger vans when the vehicles rolled over.
- Inspect seat belts and replace missing buckles, as well as broken and worn belts. Seat belts are often forgotten when they are out of sight and wedged between the seat bottom and seat back.
- Be aware that van drivers need additional training since these vans handle differently than other vehicles, especially when they are fully loaded.
- Remember that in emergencies, vans react differently than a family car. Make all drivers of these vans aware that the handling characteristics of vans are different, especially during an emergency like a tire blow out.
- Do not overload 15-passenger vans, and do not use a roof rack or strap on cargo to the back of the van. As the weight inside a van increases, so does the van's propensity to roll over.
- *Highway safety experts at the NTSB strongly suggest you use these safety tips and pass along this information to organizations that use 15-passenger vans.*





