



# CHANGES IN REGULATIONS

The regulatory actions taken by the State Board of Health in FY 2011 are as follows:

## JULY 7, 2010

### Adopted changes to the Minimum Standards for Institutions for the Aged or Infirm.

This change was made to comply with House Bill 211 (2010 Legislative Session) that authorizes the State Department of Health to immediately revoke the license and require closure of any institution for the aged or infirm to protect the health and safety of the residents.

### Adopted changes to the Minimum Standards for Personal Care Homes – Assisted Living.

This change was made to comply with House Bill 211 (2010 Legislative Session) that authorizes the State Department of Health to immediately revoke the license and require closure of any institution for the aged or infirm to protect the health and safety of the residents.

### Adopted changes to the Minimum Standards for Personal Care Homes – Residential Living.

This change was made to comply with House Bill 211 (2010 Legislative Session) that authorizes the State Department of Health to immediately revoke the license and require closure of any institution for the aged or infirm to protect the health and safety of the residents.

### Adopted changes to the Minimum Standards of Operation for Adult Foster Care Facilities.

This change was made to comply with House Bill 211 (2010 Legislative Session) that authorizes the State Department of Health to immediately revoke the license and require closure of any institution for the aged or infirm to protect the health and safety of the residents.

### Adopted revisions to Regulations Governing Individual On-Site Wastewater Disposal.

Revisions were made in order to establish and/or revise certain standards for wastewater pumpers; revise setback requirements for aggregate and aggregate replacement systems to be consistent with regional averages, and establish more detailed design criteria for disinfection processes; and further make reorganizational and other changes to improve clarity.

### Adopted the FY 2011 Mississippi State Health Plan.

## OCTOBER 13, 2010

### Adopted changes to Mississippi EMS Laws, Rules and Regulations.

These changes made updates to the minimum equipment required on ground ambulances.

### Adopted changes to Rules and Regulations Governing Reportable Disease and Conditions.

These changes made updates to list of reportable diseases.

### Adopted changes to Regulations Governing Registration of Medical Radiation Technologists.

These changes made updates to regulations consistent with state law changes made in 2010 Legislative Session.

### Adopted changes to Mississippi Trauma Care System Regulations.

These changes made revisions to Chapter 14, Mississippi Burn Care System to integrate burn care center in trauma system.

## JANUARY 12, 2011

### Adopted changes to Mississippi Conrad State 30 J-1 Visa Waiver Guidelines.

These changes require all J-1 physician applicants to have been screened for HIV and latent and active tuberculosis and other general clarification of rules of the program.

### Adopted changes to Appalachian Regional Commission “ARC” J-1 Visa Waiver Guidelines.

These changes require all J-1 physician applicants to have been screened for HIV and latent and active tuberculosis and other general clarification of rules of the program.

### Adopted changes to the Regulations Governing Licensure of Athletic Trainers.

These changes made updates to regulations consistent with state law changes made in 2010 Legislative Session.

**Adopted changes to the [Minimum Standards for Personal Care Homes – Assisted Living.](#)**

These changes define the responsibility of licensed facilities that accept and admit residents requiring mental health services.

**Adopted changes to the [Minimum Standards for Personal Care Homes – Residential Living.](#)**

These changes define the responsibility of licensed facilities that accept and admit residents requiring mental health services.

**Adopted changes to the [Minimum Standards of Operation for Adult Foster Care Facilities.](#)**

These changes define the responsibility of licensed facilities that accept and admit residents requiring mental health services.

**Adopted changes to the [Mississippi EMS: The Law, Rules and Regulations.](#)**

These changes update regulations on the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.

**APRIL 13, 2011**

**Adopted changes to the [Drug and Alcohol Testing Regulations.](#)**

This change required medication disclosure form to be submitted to the Medical Review Officer.

**Adopted changes to the [Mississippi Newborn Screening Panel.](#)**

This change added Severe Combined Immunodeficiency Disorder (SCID) to the Mississippi newborn screening panel.

## LEGISLATIVE UPDATES: 2011 REGULAR SESSION

### **SB 2220. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/30/11.**

This bill authorizes the State Department of Health to apply for federal grants and to provide an influenza vaccination school program in Mississippi for school-aged children 5 through 18 years of age and to provide certain standards for the program. The State Department of Health may seek grants and appropriations from any source and shall make information regarding federal grant and appropriations opportunities under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) available to local government agencies, local public health departments, school districts, and state and local nonprofit organizations via the agency's website.

### **SB 2435. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/6/11.**

This bill provides that the State Medical Examiner shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Public Safety subject to the approval of a panel composed of the following: (a) the Dean of the University of Mississippi Medical Center School of Medicine; (b) the Dean of the University of Mississippi School of Law; and (c) the State Health Officer.

### **SB 2734. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/26/11.**

This bill extends the automatic repealer on the Emergency Medical Services and Trauma Care Services fee program under the State Department of Health. The bill clarifies that the fees collected under the trauma system are for the exclusive benefits of the statewide trauma system. The bill adds the trade association for ambulance service providers to the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council within the State Department of Health.

The bill extends the automatic repealer on certain hospice and nursing home regulations.

The bill levies a point-of-sale fee on retail sales of all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles for deposit into the Mississippi Trauma Care Systems Fund.

### **HB 56. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/23/11.**

This bill deletes the reverter on the provision that exempts from personal care home licensure private residences in which the owner of the residence is providing personal care services to disabled or homeless veterans under an agreement with, and in compliance with, the standards prescribed by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, if the owner of the residence also provided personal care services to disabled or homeless veterans at any time during calendar year 2008.

### **HB 105. Effective on passage. Signed 4/26/11.**

This bill reenacts Sections 41-67-1 through 41-67-29 and Sections 41-67-33 through 41-67-39, which are the Mississippi Individual On-Site Wastewater Disposal System Law.

- The bill amends Section 41-67-3 to:
  - Delete certain provisions of law regarding certified professional evaluators' documentation and approval from the Department of Health when designing a design-based system; and
  - Provide that no fee shall be charged to a homeowner for training to assist the homeowner in maintaining the homeowner's system.
- The bill amends Section 41-67-6 to:
  - Allow homeowners to apply for a variance from the Department of Health by issuing a certain report for a proposed system to the department from a certified professional evaluator or registered professional engineer that the proposed wastewater treatment system will properly treat and maintain wastewater on the property and proof of errors and omissions insurance;
  - Require the installer or certified professional evaluator to notify the Department of Health at least 24 hours before beginning construction of a system;
  - Allow an installer to cover his work with soil or other surface material if a health inspector does not arrive for inspection after 24 hours from notification and to require the installer to submit an affidavit of proper installation to the department for final approval if such occurs;
  - Delete the provisions of law regarding the grandfathering of systems existing on July 1, 2008, when there is a change in property ownership, a complaint is received by the department on the system, or the system is repaired; and

- Exempt lots two acres or larger from the requirements relating to approval of individual on-site wastewater disposal systems by the department, provided that the following conditions are met:
  - > All wastewater is contained on the lot or tract;
  - > No water course, as defined in Section 51-3-3(h), of Mississippi or the United States is impacted; and
  - > A certified installer provides the department with a signed affidavit attesting that those two requirements are met.
- The bill creates the Wastewater Advisory Board for the purpose of advising the Department of Health regarding individual on-site wastewater disposal systems.
- The bill amends Section 41-67-31 to extend the date of the repealer on the Mississippi Individual On-Site Wastewater Disposal System Law to July 1, 2013.

**HB 340. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/23/11.**

This bill extends to July 1, 2014, the date of the repealer on the provision that establishes a moratorium on processing new applications for hospice licensure until all current licenses and their branches have been surveyed, with certain exceptions.

**HB 533. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/26/11.**

This bill extends to July 1, 2014, the date of the repealer on the sections of law that create the Leonard Morris Chronic Kidney Disease Leadership Task Force and prescribe its duties, and provides that task force members will not be entitled to reimbursement of expenses or to compensation.

**HB 826. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/26/11.**

This bill provides that appeals of orders of the State Department of Health pertaining to Certificates of Need for health care facilities will be made directly to the Mississippi Supreme Court instead of first to the chancery court.

In addition, the bill provides that a request for a Certificate of Need by a health care facility for an expenditure that is not for a single diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative, preventive or palliative procedure service or series of those procedures, and that exceeds the capital expenditure minimum of \$5 million, will be authorized for expedited review.

**HB 1170. Effective on passage. Signed 4/26/11.**

This bill creates an advisory committee composed of 15 members to study and provide recommendations to the Legislature regarding the areas of this state that are underserved in the retail availability of fresh fruits and vegetables and other healthy foods and the impact of the limited retail availability of those foods on proper nutrition and on obesity and related chronic illnesses, including heart attacks and diabetes.

The advisory committee is directed to develop recommendations for creating and a plan for implementing a statewide financing program to bring fresh food retailers into areas of this state that are underserved in regard to the retail availability of fresh fruits and vegetables and other healthy foods.

The advisory committee will submit a report to the Legislature not later than December 1, 2011, and will be dissolved upon the presentation of its report.

**SB 2810. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/23/11.**

This bill amends Section 41-29-115 to include Tapentadol and ANPP (Fentanyl immediate precursor 4-anilino-N-phenethyl-4-piperidine) in Schedule II of the Controlled Substances Act. Schedule III, found in Section 41-29-117, is amended to include several additional anabolic steroids and Butalbital. The bill also amends Section 41-29-119 to include Fospropofol, Carisoprodol and Tramadol in Schedule IV, and amends Section 41-29-121 to include Lacosamide in Schedule V. Other technical amendments are made to more closely conform the format of the Mississippi schedules to the federal controlled substance schedules. Section 41-29-137 is amended to conform.

**SB 2554. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/6/11.**

SB 2554 amends Sections 27-104-152 through 27-104-159 to require the Department of Finance and Administration to develop and operate a searchable website that includes information on expenditures of state funds from all funding sources. The website shall have a unique and simplified website address, and the department shall require each agency that maintains its own generally accessible Internet site to include a link to the searchable DFA website required under this act.

The searchable website must include access to an electronic summary of each grant, including amendments; subgrant, including amendments; contract, including amendments; and payment voucher, including, wherever possible, a hyperlink to the actual document in a searchable PDF format, subject to certain restrictions. DFA shall require each agency to provide to the department access to all data that is required to be accessible from the searchable website within 14 days of each expenditure, grant award, including amendments; subgrant award, including amendments; or contract, including amendments; executed by the agency.

**HB 999. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/16/11.**

This bill requires each school board to adopt a sex-related education policy to implement abstinence only or abstinence plus education into its local school district's curriculum by June 30, 2012, or to require the local school board to adopt the program developed by the Mississippi Department of Human Services and the Department of Health. The bill requires the State Department to approve each district's curriculum for sex-related education and establish a protocol to be used by districts to provide continuity in teaching the approved curriculum. The bill provides that instruction in school districts implementing abstinence plus education into the curriculum may be expanded beyond the instruction for abstinence only education within the parameters approved by the department.

The bill would define abstinence plus education; remove authority given to local school boards to vote in favor of teaching sex education without any instruction on abstinence. The bill prohibits any teaching that abortion can be used to prevent the birth of a baby. The bill would require boys and girls to be separated into different classes by gender at all times when sex-related education is discussed or taught. The bill would further revise the duties of the teen pregnancy task force and to extend the date of the repeal on the task force to July, 1, 2016. Finally, the bill would require the State Department of Mental Health and the State Department of Education, subject to the availability of funds, to establish a pilot program in each health care district, located in a school district in a county having the highest number of teen pregnancies.


**SB 2196. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 3/30/11.**

In order to operate an all-terrain vehicle on public property, every person is required to either possess a valid driver's license or to have obtained an ATV operator's certificate. The ATV safety courses offering certificates can be held by the Cooperative Extension Service and any other organization approved by the Department of Public Safety. The bill additionally requires any person under the age of 16 who is operating or riding on an ATV on public property to wear an approved crash helmet. The punishment for violation of these requirements is a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00.

**HB 344. Effective 7/1/11. Signed 4/26/11.**

The bill creates Section 93-9-10 and amends Sections 93-9-9, 93-9-28, 93-9-21 and 93-11-71 to allow for a uniform, orderly process under which a person who is already established as the legal father may petition the court to disestablish paternity and terminate child support.

Under this law, if paternity was established through signing of the child's birth certificate, then the legal father will have an increased protection. Current law in Mississippi allows a legal father 60 days to rescind any birth certificate signing. After that he cannot contest paternity except through fraud, duress, or material mistake of fact. This bill will increase that time period to one full year. He also can request genetic testing through the Department of Human Services during the one-year period; the request tolls the time to rescind which does not begin to run again until the DNA test results are revealed to the legal father.



## Leading Causes of Years of Potential Life Lost Before Age 75, Mississippi Residents, 2010






## Infant Mortality in Mississippi, 2001–2010



Infant Mortality Rate, Mississippi 2010:



## Vaccination Coverage among Children 19-35 Months, by Year, Mississippi and United States





## AIDS Rates by Year, United States and Mississippi, 2000–2009




## Tuberculosis Rates by Year, United States and Mississippi, 2001-2010



## Tuberculosis Cases by Year, Mississippi, 2001-2010




## West Nile Virus Rates by Year, United States and Mississippi, 2001-2010



## West Nile Virus Cases, Mississippi, 2001-2010




## Website: Total Visitors, Mississippi and Worldwide





## Website: Total Documents Downloaded




148,814 documents were downloaded by 51,409 Mississippi visitors in FY2011, averaging about 400 documents per day.











**FISCAL YEAR 2010: EXPENDITURES,




## General Fund Expenditures
