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Eliminating Health Disparities Through Preventive Health Services for Children

Increased preventive health services provide an opportunity to reduce health disparities through the early detection of disease. Under the Affordable Care Act, new health insurance plans or policies beginning on or after September 23, 2010, must cover certain preventive health services without co-payments or other cost sharing requirements.

On average, 42,000 deaths per year are prevented among children who receive recommended childhood vaccines.
