

This is a reminder that the MSDH Child Care Licensure Bureau will resubmit the proposed child care regulation revisions to the Mississippi State Board of Health in April. The proposed revisions will be accessible on the Mississippi Secretary of State's website 30 days before the scheduled Board meeting, which is set for April 9, 2025.



Regulations Reminders

Greetings, Early Childhood Providers,

Can you believe that it's already February? We hope the new year is off to a great start for you, your staff, children, and the families you serve. As we begin this new month, we wanted to take the opportunity to provide you with a few reminders about key rules and regulations to help you stay up to date and remain in compliance.

This month, we want to focus on the following important topics:

- Director Designees: It's crucial to ensure that the designated director has the proper qualifications and training to oversee your center when the main director is absent.
 - 1. Rule 1.5.7 Use of Director Designee:
 - (1) A director designee is an individual designated to act as the director, having all responsibility and authority of a director, during the director's short-term absence.
 - (2) A director designee shall not retain sole director authority in a facility for more than 24 total hours per calendar week.
 - (3) When the director designee is in charge of the facility, they shall have full access to all documents of the facility that are necessary for the licensing agency to conduct an inspection or complaint investigation. These documents shall include, but are not limited to, staff records, children's records, safety inspections, and any other material or documents required by the inspecting official.
- CPR/First-Aid Certification: Keeping staff members certified in CPR and First-Aid is not only a regulatory requirement but also an essential part of providing a safe environment for the children in your care.
 - 1. Rule 1.8.1 General:
 - (4) During all hours of operation, including the arrival and departure of children, a child care facility employee shall be present who holds a valid CPR certification, at any location where the children are present.
 - (5) During all hours of operation, including the arrival and departure of children, a child care facility employee shall be present, at any location where the children are present, who holds a valid first aid certificate.
- Menu Substitutions: If you need to make any menu substitutions, it's important to follow
 the correct procedures and maintain compliance with nutrition standards.
 - Appendix C: Menus (pg.4): Daily menus for all meals and snacks prepared and/or served in the child care facility shall be plainly posted. Any substitution shall be of comparable food value and shall be recorded on the menu and dated.
 - Appendix C: Menus (p.18): It is highly recommended to either serve at least one raw
 vegetable and two raw fruits per week, for a meal or snack. Younger children may have
 an appropriate substitution due to the choking hazard or the item may be cooked first.

- 4. Sun Safety: Sun safety is an important aspect of protecting the health and well-being of young children, especially when spending time outdoors. Here are some key sun safety practices to help keep children safe from harmful UV rays:
 - Rule 1.9.1 General: (3) The child care facility shall incorporate programs to encourage sun safety practices (skin cancer prevention), into activities for all age levels.
 - 2. Rule 1.9.5 Outdoor Activities:
 - (3) Sun safe practices shall be used during outdoor activities scheduled between 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. during the period April 1 to September 15.
 - (4) Sun safe practices shall be evident in the planning of all outdoor events.

We hope these reminders are helpful in keeping your facility running smoothly and in compliance with regulations. As always, if you have any questions or need additional clarification on any of the topics mentioned, don't hesitate to reach out to us.


Training Reminders

MSDH Sun Safety Tips

Sun & Heat Safety: Exposure to ultraviolet (UV) light from the sun is the most serious environmental risk factor for skin and lip cancer. Even a few serious sunburns can double your lifetime risk of cancer.

Why It Matters:

- Serious sunburns, especially during childhood and adolescence, can double the chance of developing malignant melanoma, one of the most deadly forms of skin cancer.
- Skin cancer cases have been rising among younger adults in recent years.
- Unprotected skin can be harmed by UV rays in as little as 15 minutes, yet it can take up to 12 hours for skin to show the full effects of sun exposure.

Sun Safety: Adults of all ages – and especially children – should take steps against sun exposure from April through September:

- Use sunscreen rated SPF-15 or higher with both UVA and UVB protection. Remember that last year's sunscreen may not still be effective — check the expiration date on the packaging.
- · Apply sunscreen half an hour before you go outside for full effectiveness. More sunscreen tips
- Seek shade, especially during midday when the sun's rays are strongest and do the most damage.
 Avoid direct exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., and seek shade under an umbrella or tree.
- Cover up with clothing to protect exposed skin. Loose-fitting long-sleeved shirts and long pants
 made from tightly woven fabric offer the best protection. Light clothing is not a substitute for
 sunscreen: a T-shirt only has an SPF of about 4.
- Get a hat with a wide brim to shade the face, head, ears, and neck. UV rays can reach anyone on cloudy and hazy days as well as bright and sunny days
- Wear sunglasses that wrap around and block as close to 100 percent of both UVA and UVB rays
 as possible. Sunglasses protect both the eyes and tender skin around the eyes from sun exposure







Greetings Early Childhood Family:

MDE, through the Office of Early Childhood, is offering a full-day training entitled *Fidelity Frenzy: Keeping MS Beginnings Cool and Consistent*. This in-person training will be beneficial to programs that have been implementing the Mississippi Beginning Pre-K curriculum for at least one year. Participants will take a more in depth look at the fidelity tool and learn how to use this tool as a pathway to ensure alignment in all other curricula used to teach pre-kindergarten. The fidelity tool allows the administrator or representative of the Pre-K program to monitor early childhood best practices in the pre-kindergarten classrooms. This training will be Part 1 of a series focused on the fidelity tool that includes read alouds, learning centers, and small group.

This training will be presented in-person in various locations across the state. These trainings are available to all early learning public, private, child care and Head Start administrators, principals, district leaders, directors, teachers and assistant teachers of pre-kindergarten classes. SEMIs and contact hours will be offered at no cost and CEUs will be available for a small fee.
