This free 2-Day, 16-hour course is a standardized, national-level pediatric disaster training focused on clinical preparedness, emergency management, public health, resiliency and recovery. Participants will learn specific clinical considerations for pediatric patients during natural and human-made disasters, how to develop comprehensive community and facility plans to improve pediatric clinical and post-disaster resilience, and best practices for pediatric patients across the disaster cycle. This is a new course, developed in 2023 by the Gulf 7 Pediatric Disaster Network (G7) and our partners at TEEX, specifically for the healthcare professional's perspective.
