We're pleased to present to you this year's Annual Water Quality Report. This report is designed to inform you about the quality water and services we deliver to you every day. Our constant goal is to provide you with a safe and dependable supply of drinking water. We want you to understand the efforts we make to continually improve the water treatment process and protect our water resources. We are committed to ensuring the quality of your water. Our water source is from three wells drawing water from the Citronelle formation Aquifer.

Our source water assessment has been conducted and it shows our wells have a higher susceptibility to contamination.

I'm pleased to report that our drinking water meets all federal and state requirements.

This report shows our water quality and what it means.

If you have any questions about this report or concerning your water utility, please contact HWY 28 Water Assn. at 601-849-4795. We want our valued customers to be informed about their water utility. If you want to learn more, please attend any of our regularly scheduled meetings. They are held on the second Monday of the month at the Highway 28 water office at 7:00 P.M.

Highway 28 Water Association routinely monitors for constituents in your drinking water according to Federal and State laws. This table shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2018. As water travels over the land or underground, it can pick up substances or contaminants such as microbes, inorganic and organic chemicals, and radioactive substances. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It's important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk.

In this table you will find many terms and abbreviations you might not be familiar with. To help you better understand these terms we've provided the following definitions:

Non-Detects (ND) - laboratory analysis indicates that the constituent is not present.

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Action Level - the concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Treatment Technique (TT) - A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Maximum Contaminant Level - The MCL is the highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal - The $MCLG$ is the level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.

Inorganic Contaminants:

(10) Barium. Some people who drink water containing barium in excess of the MCL over many years could experience an increase in their blood pressure.

(14) Copper. Copper is an essential nutrient, but some people who drink water containing copper in excess of the action level over a relatively short amount of time could experience gastrointestinal distress. Some people who drink water containing copper in excess of the action level over many years could suffer liver or kidney damage. People with Wilson's Disease should consult their personal doctor.

(17) Lead. Infants and children who drink water containing lead in excess of the action level could experience delays in their physical or mental development. Children could show slight deficits in attention span and learning abilities. Adults who drink this water over many years could develop kidney problems or high blood pressure.

(19) Nitrate. Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing Nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and if untreated may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue-baby syndrome.

***** Additional Information for Lead*****

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Highway 28 Water Association is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline or at <http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead>. God's will to save

"I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, and prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:1-4).

For the past several months we have been declaring in the Narrow Way the glorious truth of the atonement made by our Lord Jesus Christ for His chosen people. The scriptures teach that our Lord made a real atonement - his death actually secured the salvation of all for whom He died. We have shown the doctrine of Particular, or Limited Atonement first by the texts that plainly say that Christ died for His elect (see Matthew 1:21; John 10:15; Acts 20:28; and Ephesians 5:25, e.g.). Secondly we showed that the Atonement made by

Last week we showed that the word "all" is always used in a qualified sense. For example, we read in 1 Timothy 6:10 that the "love of money is the root of all evil." However we know that many sins spring from other motives than the love of money or material gain. Money-love is not necessarily the root of sexual sins. Also many sins are rooted in sheer human meanness. Faithful exegesis and interpretation and sanctified common sense teach us that the true meaning of 1 Timothy 6:10 is that money-love is the root of all kinds of evil. It is not hard to see that the same is true of the "all men" in 1 Timothy 2:4.

First of all, whatever God wills shall surely come to pass. God's absolutely sovereign, He is in the heavens and has done whatsoever He pleased (Psalms 115:3). His counsel stands, and He does all His pleasure (Isaiah 46:10). He has decreed from all eternity all things whatsoever may come to pass. He works all things after the counsel of His Own will (Ephesians 1:11). If 1 Timothy 2:4 means that it is God's will to save

and Paul and the church at that time should thank the Lord for devils like Caesar Nero. But since the Holy Ghost had Paul to go on and exhort to pray "for kings and all in authority," it is evident the sense is that we are to pray for all kinds of men, including kings and peasants.

So, we see from the context, and from other scriptures, that God will have

only know the names of a few of the billions of people on planet earth. We cannot pray for "all men" for the simple fact we do not know all men (unless you pray like we did when we were children - "I Lord just bless everybody"). Furthermore, it does not seem reasonable that Timothy

all kinds of men to be saved. He has chosen for salvation all kinds and classes of men. He will have Jews and Gentiles to be saved. He will have kings and peasants to be saved. He will have men and women to be saved. He will have rich and poor to be saved. He has chosen His people out of every nation, kindred, and tribe. (See 1 Corinthians 1:2:6-29

and Revelation 5:9.) An all those that God will have to be saved shall surely be saved without the loss of one! Note well, the text does not say that God will have all men to be saved, but to be saved. This is the gospel that God saves sinners. He does not fix them so they can save themselves. Thank the Lord for His sovereign grace!
