Subject: Change in Fee Categories

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Mississippi is an Agreement State. We became an Agreement State on July 1, 1962. Through the Agreement State Program, 40 States have signed formal agreements with the NRC, under which those States have assumed regulatory responsibility over certain byproduct and source material, as well as, small quantities of special nuclear material. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) reviews Agreement State programs for continued adequacy to protect public health and safety, and ensure compatibility with the agency's regulatory program. The NRC and Agreement States jointly develop new regulations, regulatory guidance, and other regulatory initiatives.

The Division of Radiological Health, Mississippi State Department of Health, is completely funded by licensed and registered users of radiation sources. The Mississippi State Department of Health requested an amendment to the Mississippi Code Ann. § 45-14-31 as well as other licensing fees such as ambulance license, healthcare facilities license, etc.

These fees are used to inspect facilities for compliance to radiation health and safety. House Bill 289 was approved during the 2016 legislative session increasing our fees for the first time since 2006. The bill approved the Mississippi State Board of Health to raise fees two (2) times with a 15% fee increase for all fees that were not in statute (Mississippi Code Ann. § 45-14-31). For the fees in statute, they could not be raised but 5%.

The Mississippi Radiation Protection Law of 1976, specifically Mississippi Code Ann. § 45-14-31 was amended to take all fees out of state statute with the exception of Category 1 licensing fees (\$3675.00); Category 2 licensing fees (\$1890.00); and healing arts x-ray tubes, such as clinical diagnostic, dental, veterinary, and chiropractic (\$150.00/tube). Mississippi State Board of Health approved the \$115.00/x-ray tube as requested by the Mississippi State Department of Health. The fee for mammography, CT, and fluoroscopic units was increased to \$150.00 per unit. The new fees go in effect June 1, 2019.
