**SUBJECT:** Updated COVID-19 Testing Priorities and Addition of SAR-CoV-2 to the Reportable Disease List, Mississippi March 10, 2020

**This guidance supersedes previous guidance and recommendations provided in the MSDH Health Alert dated February 29, 2020.**

- SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, has now been added to the Mississippi List of Reportable Diseases and Conditions as a Class 1A disease requiring MSDH notification by phone within 24 hours of diagnosis.
- COVID-19 testing is available at the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory (MPHL). MSDH has the necessary testing capacity to support the state’s COVID-19 response and MPHL is actively performing testing to identify cases in Mississippi.
- Expanded capacity for testing is also becoming available at several commercial laboratories through an FDA Emergency Use Authorization. This additional capacity allows Mississippi clinicians access to testing a wider group of symptomatic patients.
- All physicians, providers and healthcare facilities in Mississippi should **Identify** patients with signs and symptoms compatible with COVID-19 and determine whether the patient should be tested; **Isolate** patients using appropriate infection control and **Call** MSDH if COVID-19 is suspected at 601-576-7725 (601-576-7400 after hours, holidays and weekends).
- Patients with COVID-19 have presented with fever and/or symptoms of acute respiratory illness (e.g., cough, difficulty breathing).

**COVID-19 Testing Priorities at the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory\* (prior approval required):**

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Patients, including healthcare personnel, who within 14 days of symptom onset had close contact with a suspect or laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 patient, or who have a history of travel from affected geographic areas (see <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/index.html">https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/index.html</a>) within 14 days of their symptom onset.</li> </ul> |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hospitalized patients who have signs and symptoms compatible with COVID-19 (and without alternative explanatory diagnosis (e.g., influenza) ).</li> </ul>   |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Other symptomatic individuals at higher risk for poor outcomes, including those who are ≥ 65 years, immunocompromised or have chronic medical conditions (e.g., diabetes, heart disease, receiving immunosuppressive medications, chronic lung disease, chronic kidney disease).</li> </ul>   |

\*For patients who do not meet the above priorities, clinicians may also elect to submit samples to a commercial laboratory for SARS-CoV-2 testing. Submission of samples to commercial laboratories does not require prior approval from MSDH. If you have questions, please contact MSDH.



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## Steps for Sample Submission to the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory

Physicians and providers should immediately implement recommended infection prevention and control practices when COVID-19 is suspected based on symptoms and the above priorities ([Healthcare Infection Control Guidance](#)).

1. Contact the MSDH Office of Epidemiology at 601-576-7725 (601-576-7400 after hours, holidays and weekends).
2. Complete [SARS-CoV-2 \(COVID-19\) Testing Requisition](#)
3. Complete the [COVID-19 Person Under Investigation and Case Report Form](#) and fax to the Office of Epidemiology at 601-576-7497
4. Review the [Coronavirus \(COVID-19\) Specimen Collection and Shipping Guidance](#). **NOTE: Both an NP specimen using a synthetic swab and a separate OP specimen using a synthetic swab must be collected. NP and OP swabs may be placed in separate vials of viral transport media or both can be placed in a single vial.**

**Definition of Alerting Vocabulary and Message Specification Settings**

**Originating Agency:** A unique identifier for the agency originating the alert.

**Alerting Program:** The program sending the alert or engaging in alerts and communications using PHIN Communication and Alerting (PCA) as a vehicle for their delivery.

**Message Identifier:** A unique alert identifier that is generated upon alert activation (MSHAN-yyymmdd-hhmm-TTT (**ALT=Health Alert**, **ADV=Health Advisory**, **UPD=Health Update**, **MSG/INFO=Message/Info Service**)).

**Program (HAN) Type:** Categories of Health Alert Messages.

**Health Alert:** Conveys the highest level of importance; warrants immediate action or attention.

**Health Advisory:** Provides important information for a specific incident or situation; may not require immediate action.

**Health Update:** Provides updated information regarding an incident or situation; unlikely to require immediate action.

**Health Info Service:** Provides Message / Notification of general public health information; unlikely to require immediate action.

**Status (Type):**

- Actual: Communication or alert refers to a live event
- Exercise: Designated recipients must respond to the communication or alert
- Test: Communication or alert is related to a technical, system test and should be disregarded



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**Message Type:**

- Alert: Indicates an original Alert
- Update: Indicates prior alert has been Updated and/or superseded
- Cancel: Indicates prior alert has been cancelled
- Error: Indicates prior alert has been retracted

**Reference:** For a communication or alert with a Message Type of “Update” or “Cancel”, this attribute contains the unique Message Identifier of the original communication or alert being updated or cancelled. “n/a” = Not Applicable.

**Severity:**

- Extreme: Extraordinary threat to life or property
- Severe: Significant threat to life or property
- Moderate: Possible threat to life or property
- Minor: Minimal threat to life or property
- Unknown: Unknown threat to life or property

**Acknowledgement:** Indicates whether an acknowledgement on the part of the recipient is required to confirm that the alert was received, and the timeframe in which a response is required (Yes or No).

**Sensitive:**

- Sensitive: Indicates the alert contains sensitive content
- Not Sensitive: Indicates non-sensitive content

**Message Expiration:** Undetermined.

**Urgency:** Undetermined. Responsive action should be taken immediately.

**Delivery Time:** Indicates the timeframe for delivery of the alert (15, 60, 1440, 4320 minutes (.25, 1, 24, 72 hours)).
