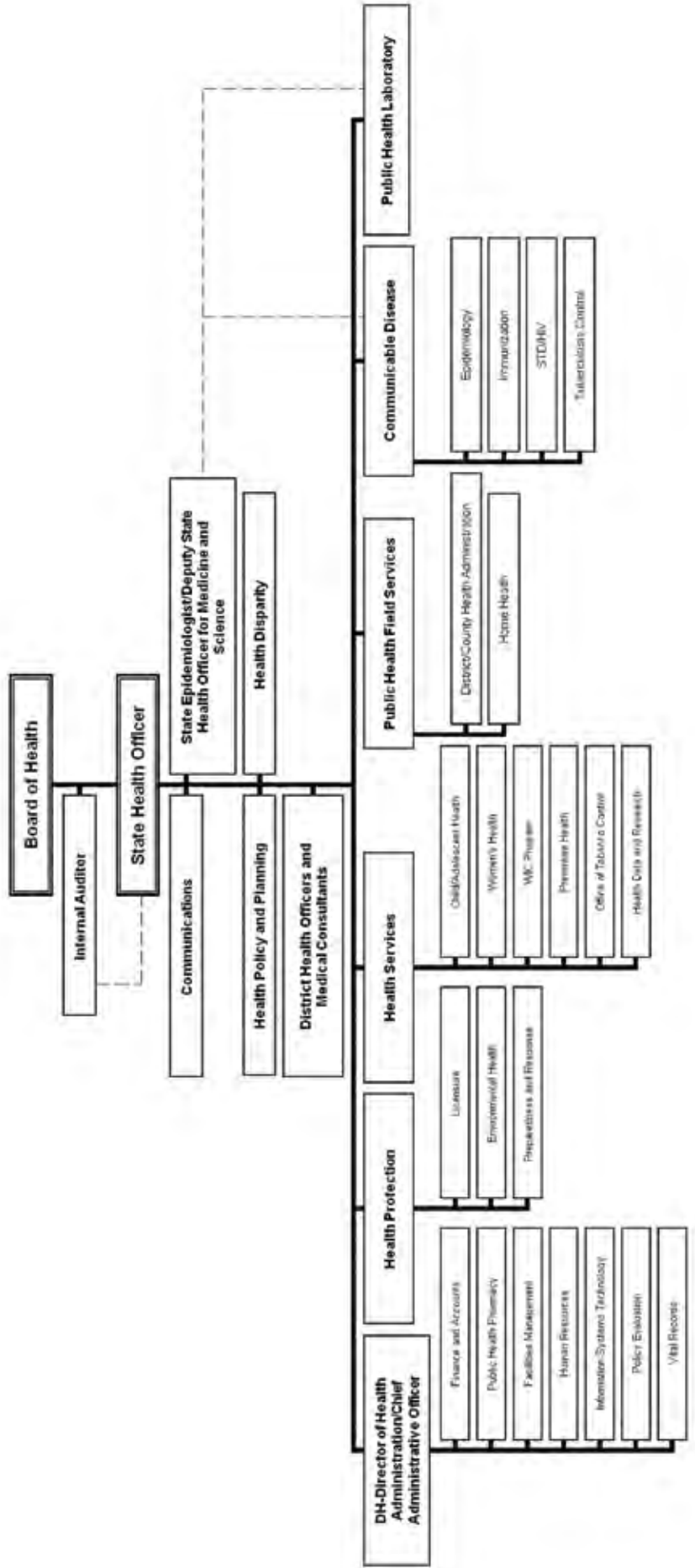
# Mississippi State Department of Health Functional Organizational Chart

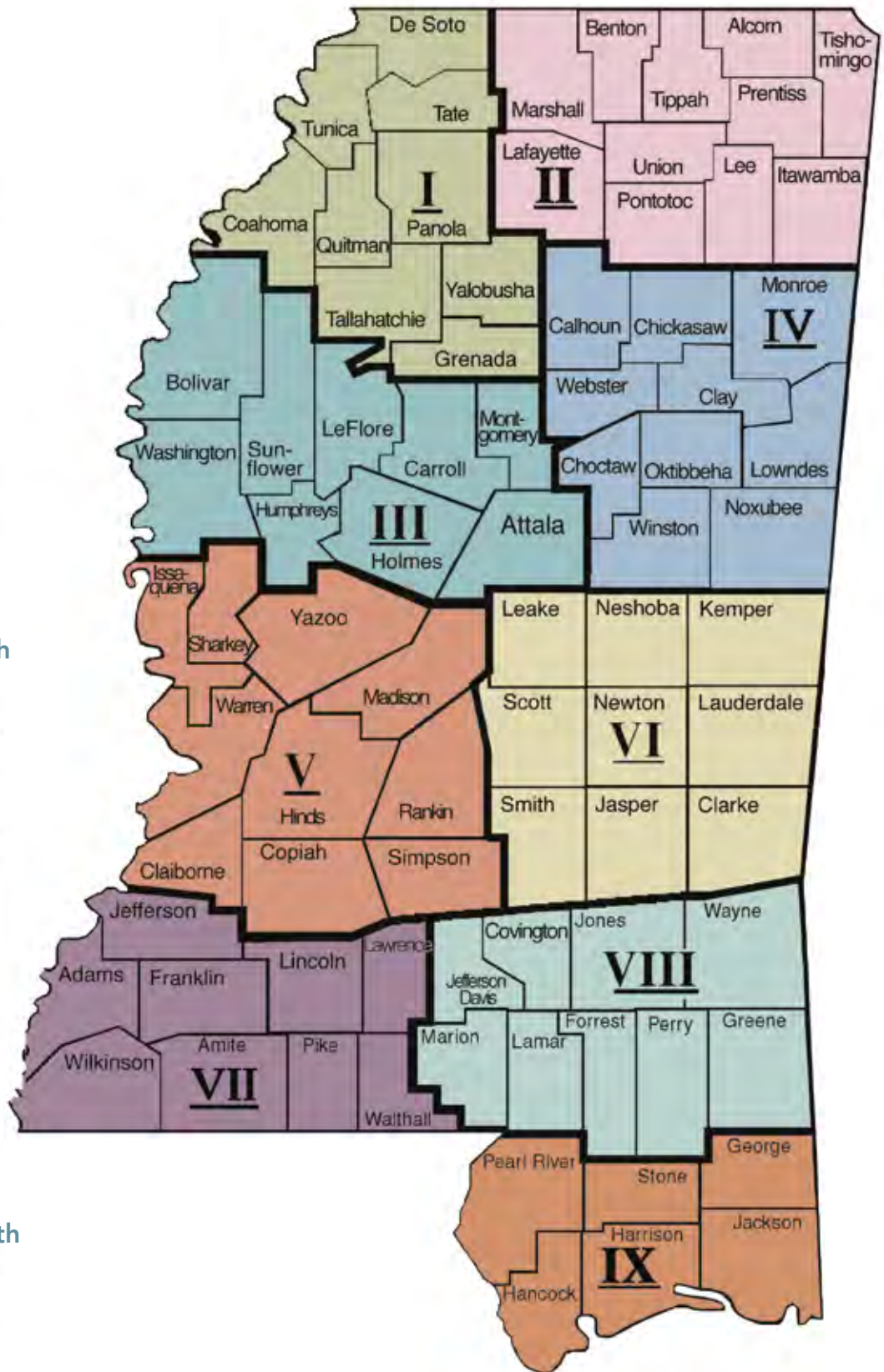

# Changes in Regulations

The regulatory actions taken by the State Board of Health in FY 2009 are as follows:

## July 9, 2008

### Adopted a change to the [Minimum Standards for Adult Foster Care Facilities.](#)

This change added requirement that adult foster care facilities perform criminal history record checks of employees.

### Adopted changes to the [Regulations Governing Licensure of Professional Art Therapists.](#)

These changes added another member to the Professional Art Therapist Advisory Council and changed designation of "chairman" to "chairperson."

### Adopted changes to the [Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities and Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities for 12 or Fewer Children in the Operator's Home.](#)

These changes provided that if any entity exempt from the requirements to be licensed, but voluntarily chooses to obtain a license, then such entity would be subject to all provisions and requirement of the licensing law and regulations.

### Adopted the [Mississippi State Department of Health FY 2009 Water Quality Analysis Fee Schedule.](#)

This action adopted the Water Quality Analysis Fee for Fiscal Year 2009 pursuant to the Mississippi Safe Drinking Water Act of 1997.

### Adopted changes to the [Minimum Standards of Operation for Hospice.](#)

These changes clarified the geographic service area of a hospice be within a 50-mile radius of the Parent Office premises and provided that existing satellite branch offices operating outside the 50-mile radius of the Parent Office premises prior to the effective date of the regulations remain on the license with the Parent facility.

### Adopted changes to the [Mississippi Trauma Care Regulations.](#)

These changes provided for the implementation of the "Play or Pay" system of participation in the trauma care system; increased mandatory reporting data for trauma; and provided for financial assistance from the Mississippi Burn Care Fund to family members of burn victims incurring out-of-state travel expenses.

### Adopted changes to the [Minimum Standards of Operation for Mississippi Hospitals.](#)

These changes added data reporting requirements to the statewide trauma registry by hospitals that have organized emergency services or departments.

### Adopted changes to the [Mississippi EMS: The Law, Rules and Regulations.](#)

These changes allow for the use of and add as an optional skill "Drug Assisted Intubation" using benzodiazepines and update the performance standards of an EMT Paramedic to include routes of administration consistent with the National Standard Curriculum and as approved by the Medical Direction, Training and Quality Assurance Committee.

### Adopted the [FY 2009 Mississippi State Health Plan.](#)

## October 8, 2008

### Adopted changes to the [Mississippi Trauma Care Regulations.](#)

These changes address compliance with these regulations by allowing the withholding of funds; require compliance with regional policies; and require trauma registry data be submitted to both Bureau of Emergency Medical Services and respective region at least monthly.

### Adopted changes to the [Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities and Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities for 12 or Fewer Children in the Operator's Home.](#)

These changes make licensure fee changes as enacted in Senate Bill 2451.

### Adopted changes to the [Regulations Governing Individual On-Site Wastewater Disposal: Administrative.](#)

These changes added requirements and a fee for the inspections for final approval of individual on-site wastewater disposal systems.

## January 14, 2009

### Adopted changes to the Regulations Governing Licensure of Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants.

These changes address requirements for receiving continuing education credit for maintaining license.

### Adopted changes to the Regulations Governing Licensure of Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists.

These changes address the amount of online and home study sources of continuing education credits during a reporting period.

### Adopted revisions to the Minimum Standards of Operation for Home Health Agencies.

These changes make revisions to the duties of the physical therapists in supervising physical therapy assistants.

### Adopted new rules and regulations: Mississippi's Healthcare Data System Registry.

### Adopted revisions to the Regulations Governing Licensure of Hearing Aid Specialists.

These changes address requirements for receiving continuing education credit for maintaining license.

### Adopted changes to the Mississippi Trauma Care Regulations.

These changes allow the J.M. Still Burn Center to participate in the burn care reimbursement fund and allow prorating of fees to be charged to certain acute care hospitals for non-participation in the Mississippi Trauma System and for participation at a level less than the assessment level of the facility.

## April 8, 2009

### Adopted changes to the Mississippi EMS: The Law, Rules and Regulations.

These changes address high visibility safety apparel as required equipment on EMS vehicles and requirement that EMS Drivers, Medical First Responders, and EMTs wear high visibility safety apparel. Also, changes were made to the requirements of Air Ambulance Medical Direction, EMT and Medical First Responder training, and performance standards for EMT-Paramedic.

### Adopted changes to the Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities and Regulations Governing Licensure of Child Care Facilities for 12 or Fewer Children in the Operator's Home.

These changes address the requirements for a "Temporary License," requirements regarding criminal history record checks, sex offender record checks, and child abuse central registry checks, and requirements for outdoor playground area.

### Adopted changes to the Regulations for Control of Radiation in Mississippi.

These various changes were necessary to remain in compatibility with recent revisions made by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

### Adopted changes to the Regulation Governing the Fluoridation of Community Water Systems.

This regulation was adopted to promulgate requirements for fluoridation of community water systems and establish operational and technical requirements for fluoridation programs.

# Changes in State Law

## **Senate Bill 2573 – MS Public Health Laboratory; establish.**

Creates for the first time in statute the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory and establishes in the State Treasury a special fund to be known as the Mississippi Public Health Laboratory Fund. The new law does not increase money, it simply allows for fees generated by the public health lab to go into a fund for the coverage of operational and administrative expenditures by the lab.

## **Senate Bill 2578 – Uniform Controlled Substances Law; conform Schedule II with federal law.**

MSDH is required by statute to assist the legislature of the State of Mississippi in conforming state law with federal law regarding controlled schedule II substances. The new law adds Oripavine to the schedule and, for housekeeping, alphabetizes our State's schedule.

## **Senate Bill 2580 – MS Qualified Health Center Grant Program; continue program and revise administrative expense authority.**

MSDH grants funds to qualified health centers to help in providing care to uninsured or medically indigent patients in Mississippi. This law extends the repealer on the program, allowing the department to continue administering these grants. It also increases the authority to use grant proceeds to pay reasonable administrative expenses of the program.

## **HB 453 – Hospice program; delete requirement for composition of governing body of.**

This law removes the language that directed the number and type of members that must make up a governing board of a hospice program.

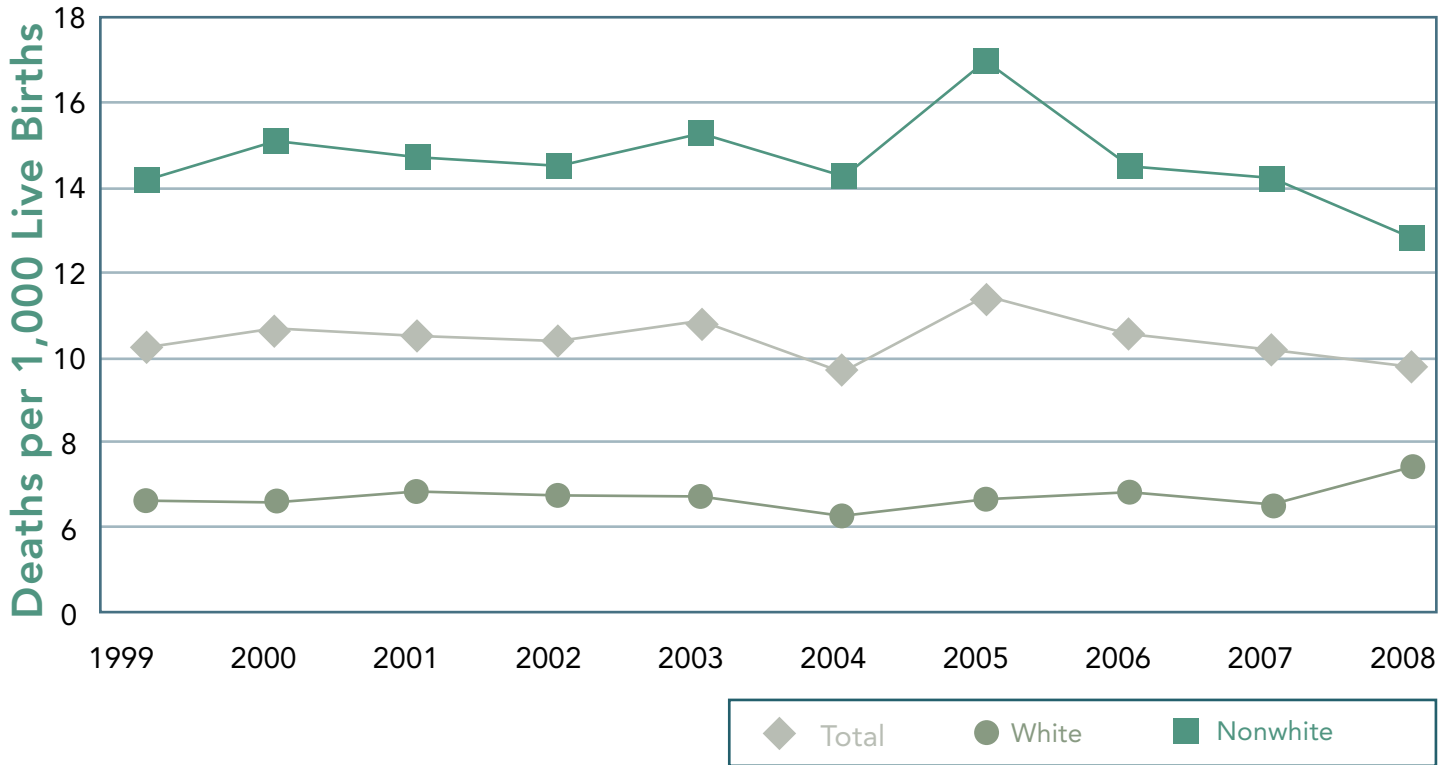

### Infant Mortality Rate Mississippi 2008

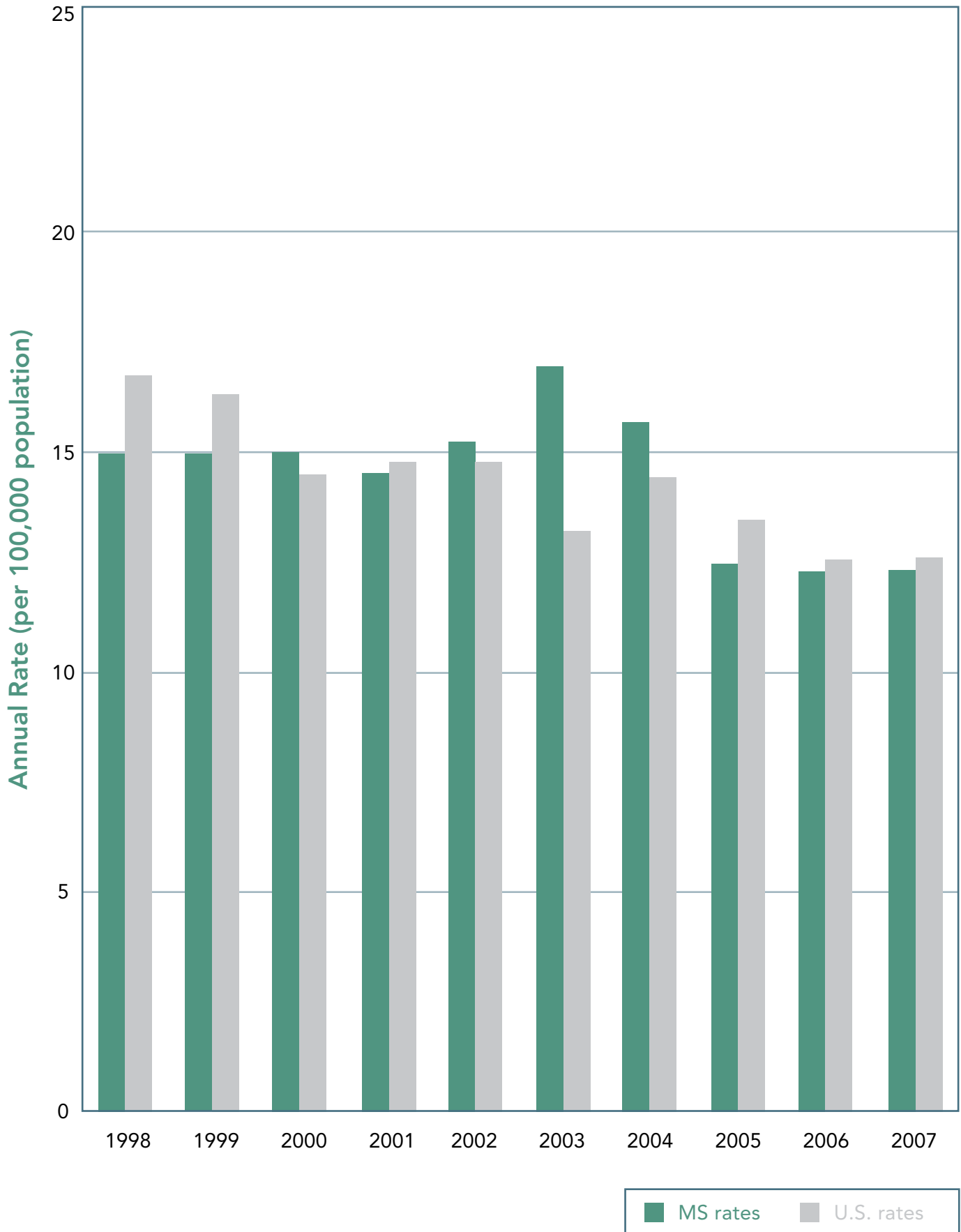

## Reported AIDS Annual Rates for the U.S. and Mississippi, 1998–2007

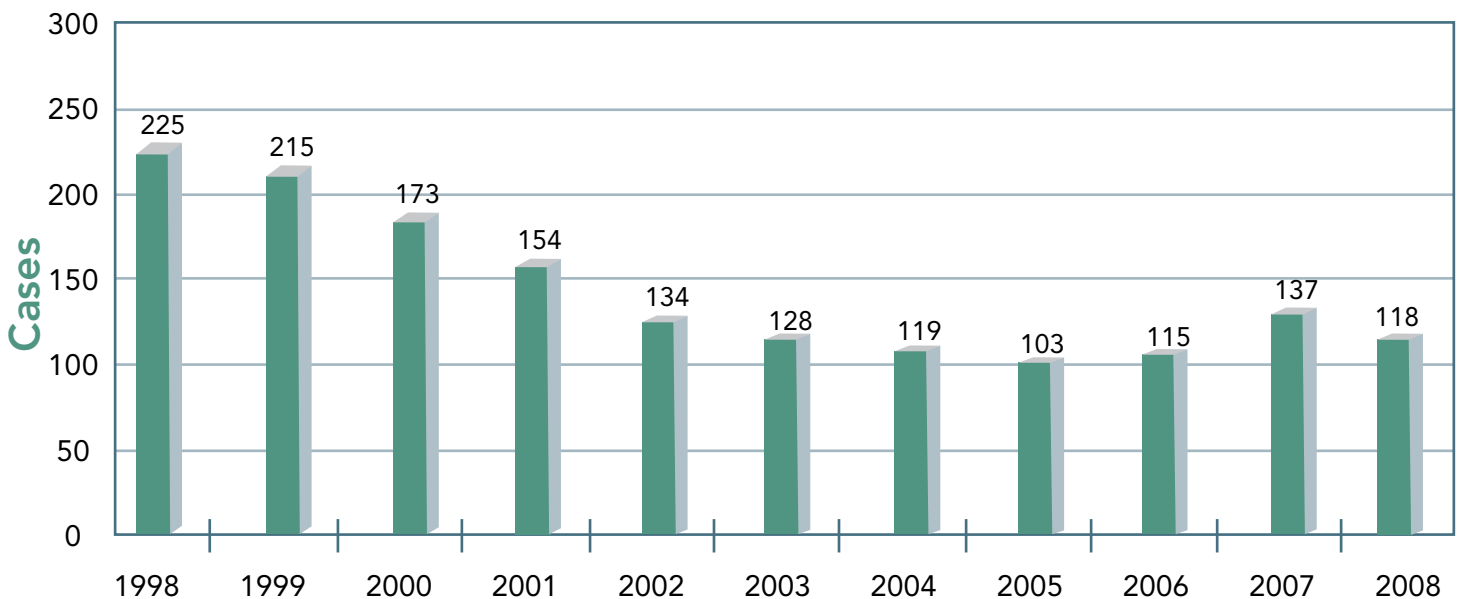




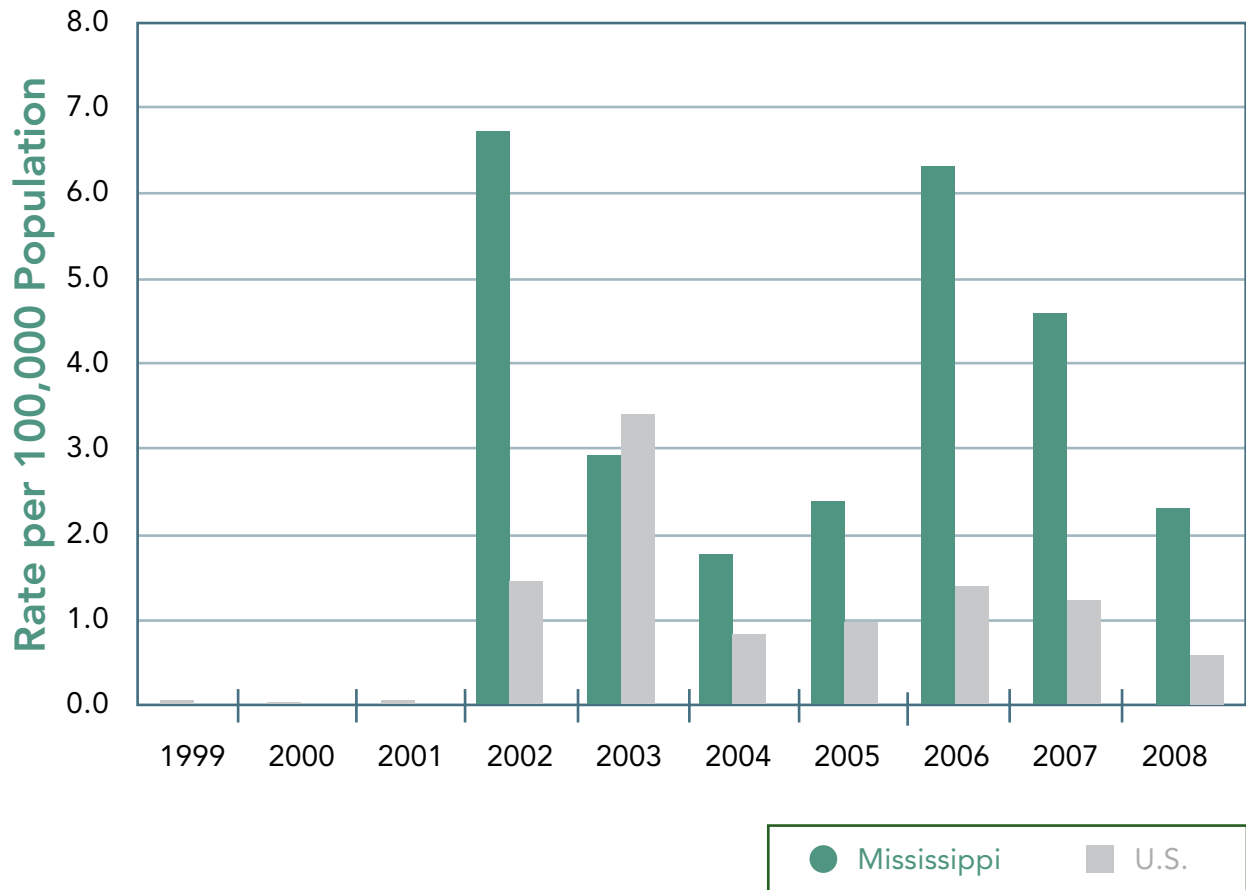
## Tuberculosis Case Rates MS vs U.S. Case Rates, 1998-2008



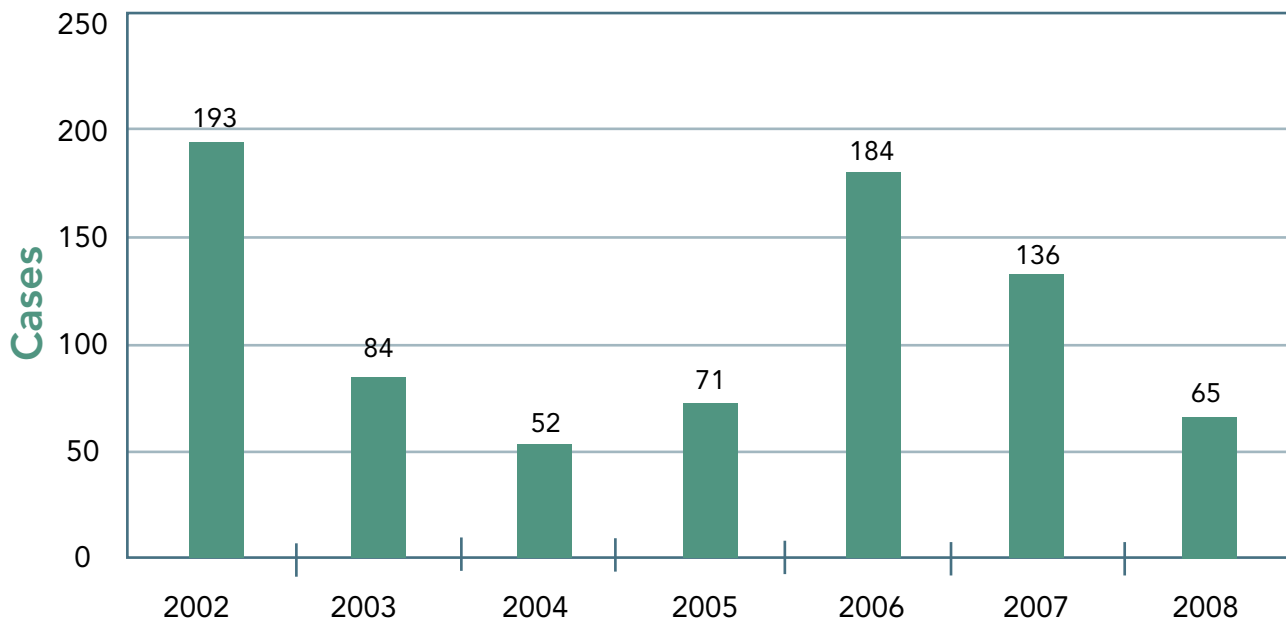
## MS Reported TB Cases, 1998-2008



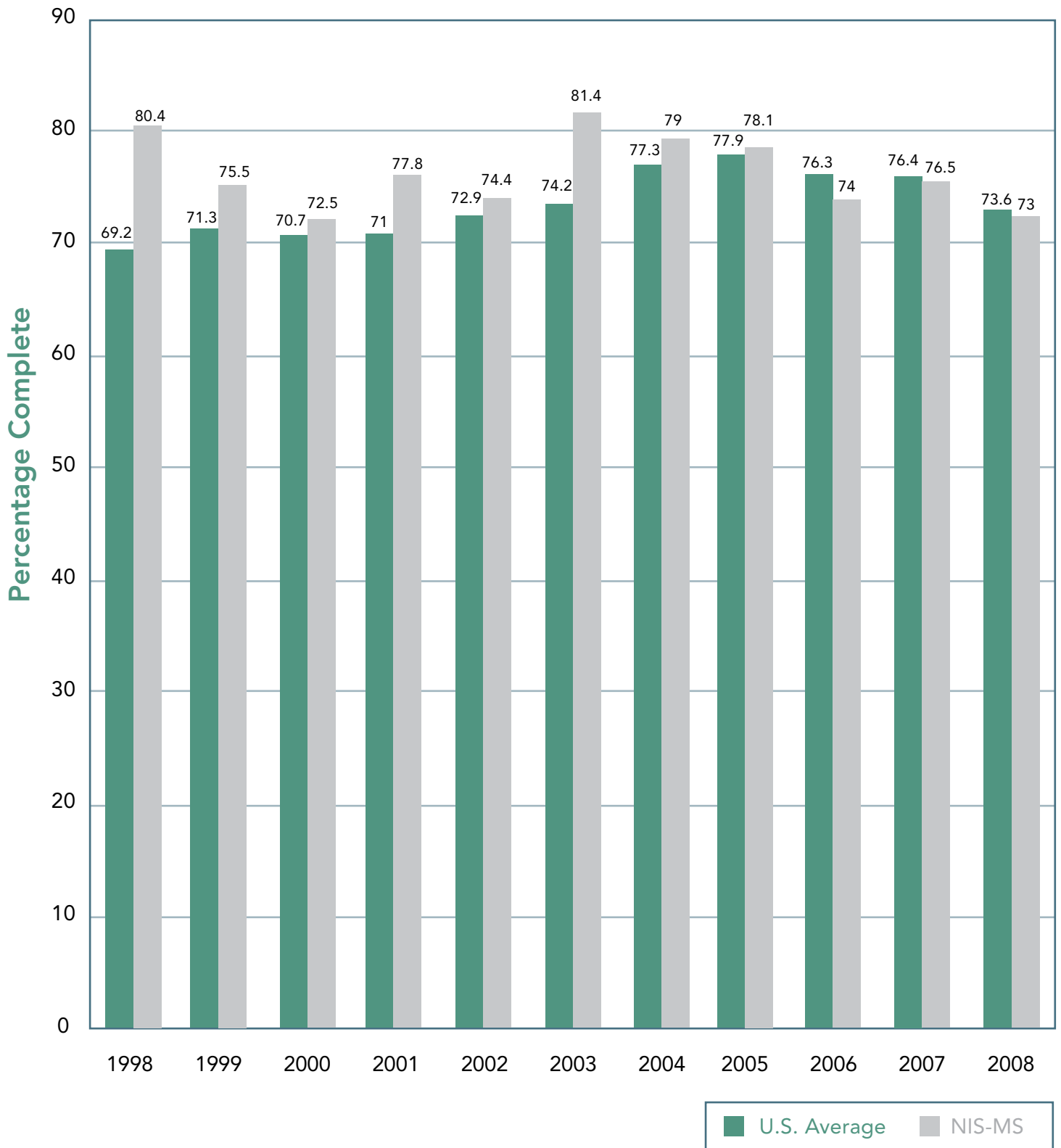
### West Nile Virus Case Rates, United States and Mississippi, 1999-2008

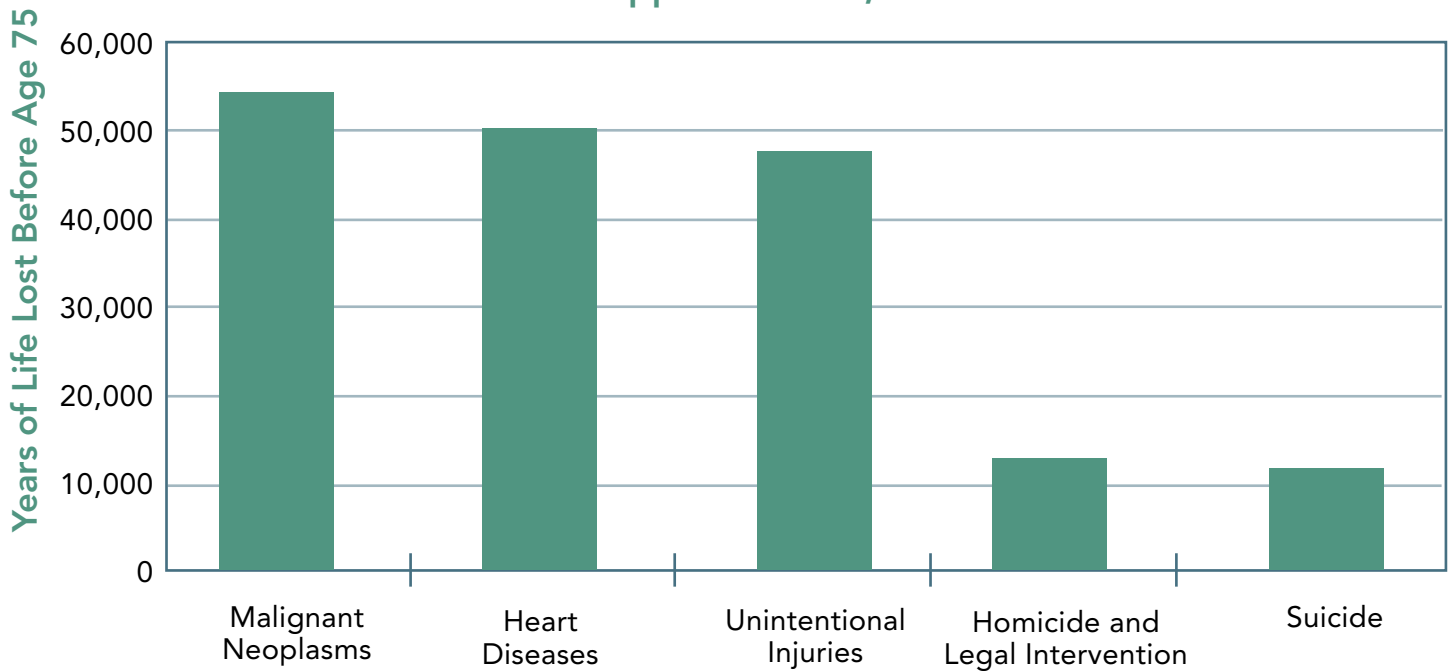

## Leading Causes of Years of Potential Life Lost Before Age 75 Mississippi Residents, 2008



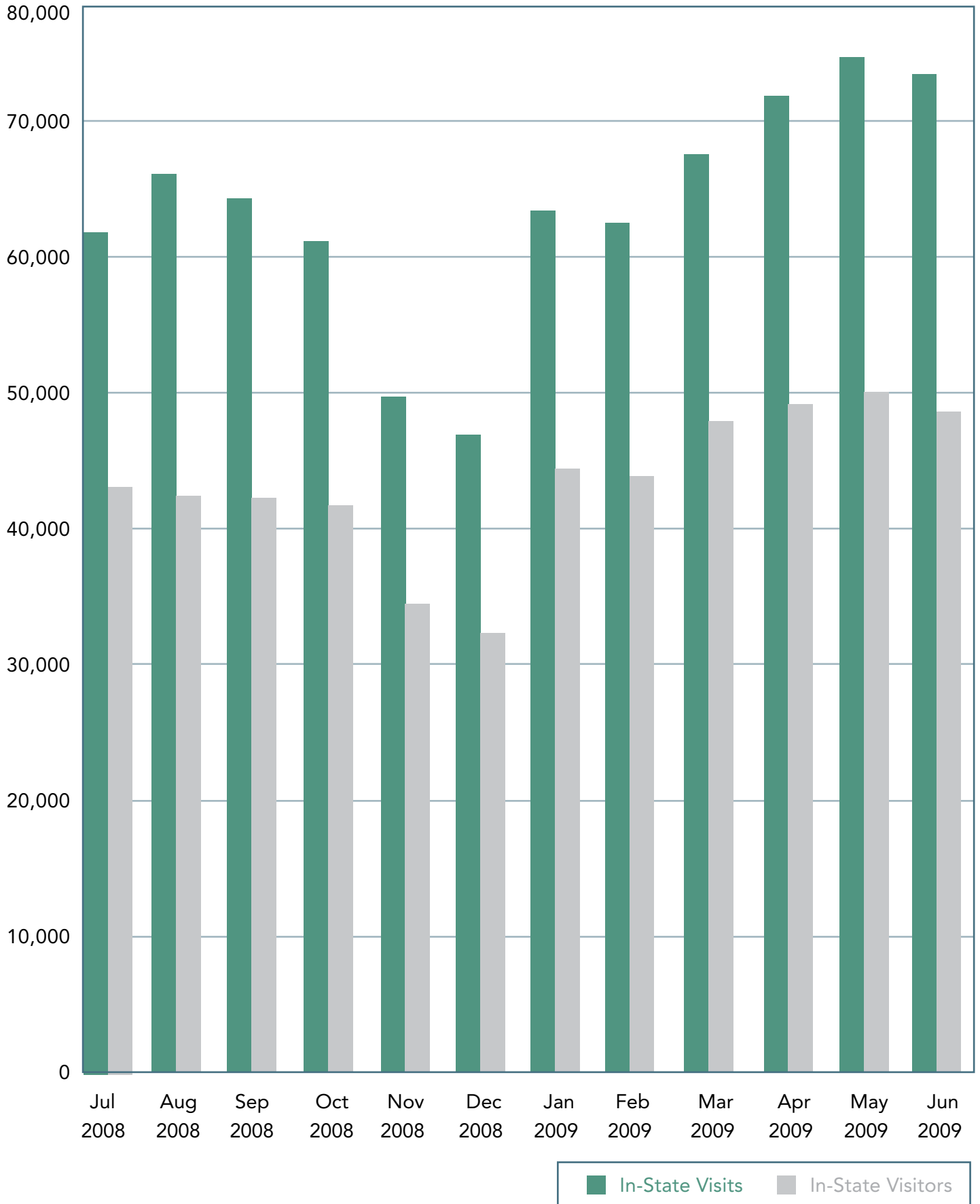

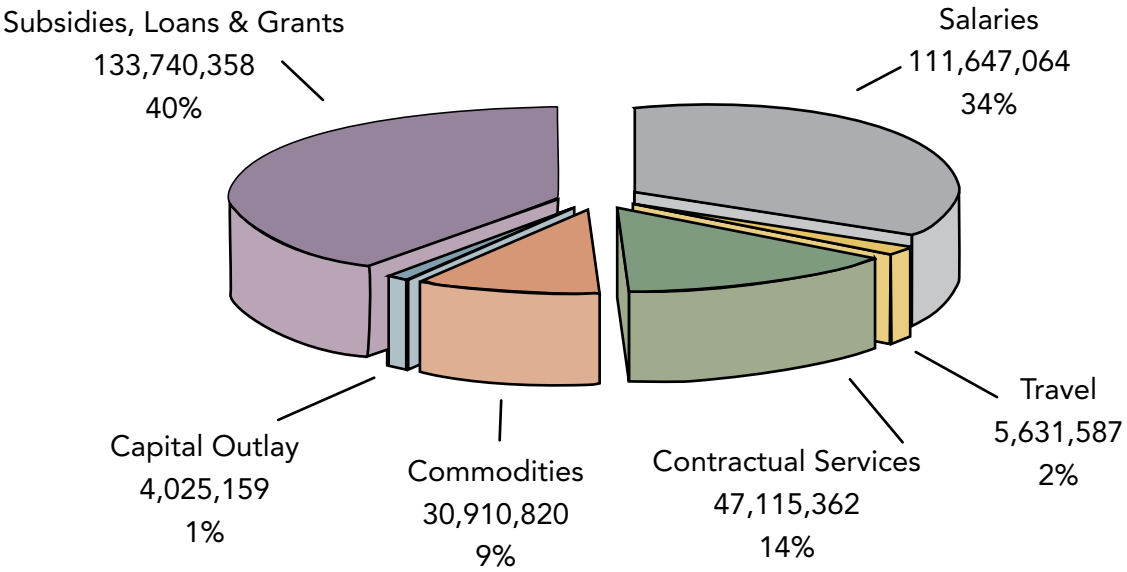

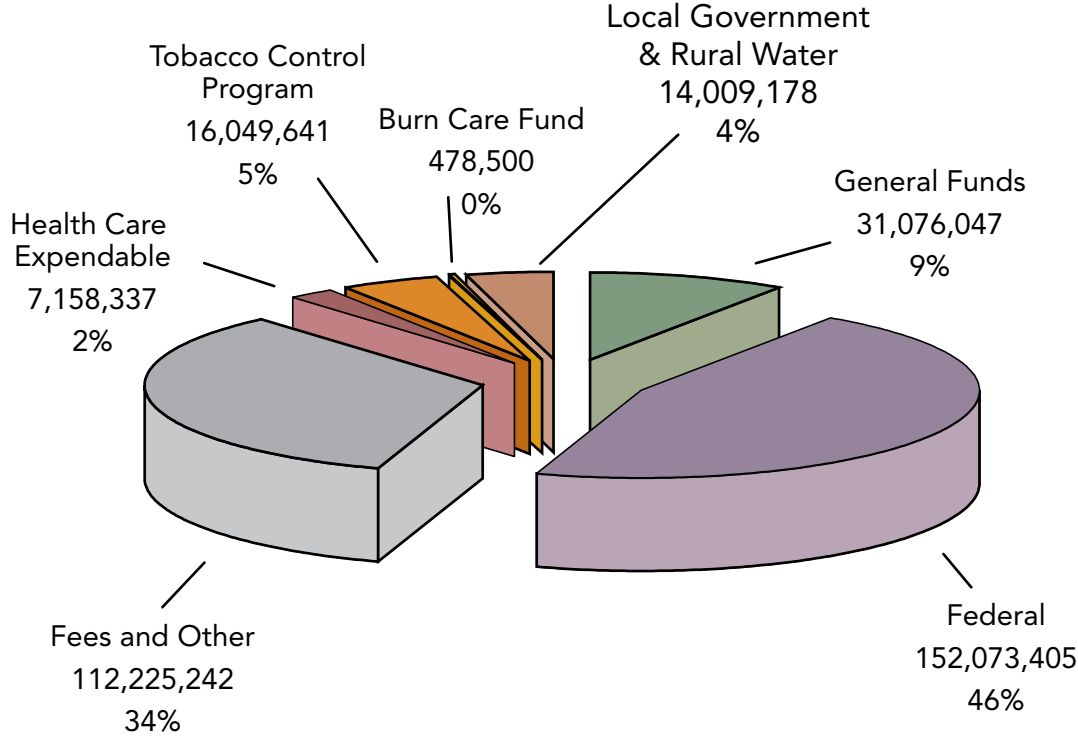

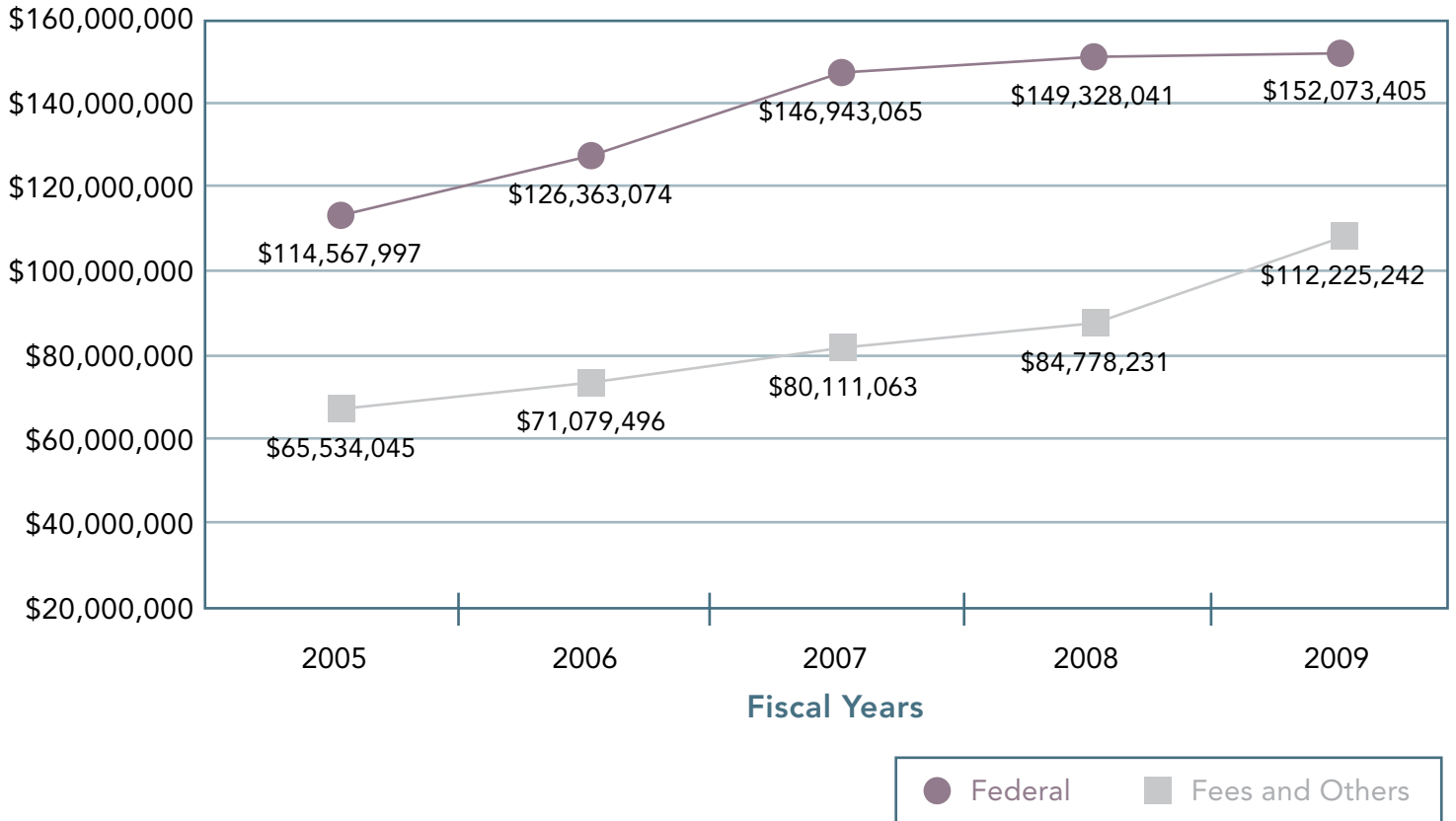
