MINUTES

Welcome/Introductions

The meeting was called to order by C. G. Marx, Chair, at 12:51 p.m. All participants were welcomed and introduced themselves.

Review and Approve Minutes

Meeting minutes from the Sept. 6th meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

Committee Updates

The membership and purpose of each committee was shared.

Professional Education – Kim Ward (C), Ashley Grillis, Rebecca Lowe The purpose of the Professional Education Committee is to provide guidance on the training for the various professionals involved in the EHDI system. No update was provided by the committee.

Family Engagement – Julie Seawright (C), Sandra Edwards, Ben Wagenknecht The purpose of the Family Engagement Committee is to provide guidance on communications with and support for families as well as engagement strategies for supporting family leadership. Julie Seawright has stepped down as the Chair and Dr. Edwards has retired, so the team will need to be revamped. No update was provided by the committee.

<u>Business</u>

Elect Chair & Vice Chair for 2019-2020

- Ben Wagenknecht was nominated and elected Chair Elect
- Kim Ward was nominated and elected Vice-Chair Elect

Nominations for members

- Stacy C stated that she received 3 nominations for new membership which were Caitlin Ramage (Parent), Jennifer Wiles (audiologist, JSU), and Courtney Turner (Audiologist, USM).
- Existing members who requested to be reappointed are: Kim Ward, Marilyn Johnson, Valerie Linn, Koleshia O'Quinn, Krista Guynes and Laura Gremillion.

Billing of Hearing Screenings

Ms. Callender updated the EHDI-AC on the issue regarding the billing of hearing screenings. Families have been receiving bills for newborn hearing screenings which are included in the newborn birth package for Medicaid and most insurers. This was confirmed with the Division of Medicaid and the MS Department of Insurance. However, the use of outsourcing companies has led to the billing of families directly for these screenings, for which the hospitals have technically already been reimbursed.

After the previous EHDI-AC meeting, Ms. Callender and Dr. Marx drafted a letter to be shared with hospitals outlining their obligations under MS code 41-90 to ensure all newborns are screened for hearing impairment.

The EHDI-AC discussed who should sign the letter and who should receive a copy. It was agreed to send a copy of the letter to all birthing hospitals. Ms. Bilbro suggested also sending the letter to the hospital association, so leaders understood the implications of the decision to outsource screenings. It was recommended the chair, past and present, with the vice-chair sign the letter.

Communication Ad Hoc Committee

Ms. Callender recommended the EHDI-AC form and ad hoc Communication Committee to create a quarterly newsletter. Ms. Linn and Ms. Carr agreed to form a committee.

Program Updates

Personnel Changes

- Brandi Jones joined the EHDI-MS team as a Hearing Follow-up Coordinator.
- Jack Liu has left as the Data Manager and is focusing on data systems.

Website Update

Ms. Callender demonstrated updates to the EHDI website (msdh.ms.gov/EHDI)

Natus/iCMS Update

 A new contract has been proposed to go into effect after January 2020 to shift the iCMS system to being hosted by Natus. This would allow non-MSDH personnel to access it directly.

EHDI-MS Conference

The EHDI-MS conference is scheduled for Feb. 4-5, 2020. The two-day conference will have one day of traditional conference keynote and break-out sessions and another day of meetings and targeted trainings. MS Families as Allies will lead a family leadership training on Feb 5th. The two themes being considered are: *It Takes a Team* and *Bridging the Gap; Connecting Families, Adults who are DHH and Providers*. Recommended keynote speakers include Rachel St. John (pediatric otolaryngology specialist, JCIH Member), Djenne-Amal Morris (parent, Hands & Voices), and Johnnie Sexton (Director, The Care Project).

Funding and Grant Activities

Ms. Callender informed the EHDI-AC that EHDI-MS expects to be awarded a four-year grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to fund the program in Mississippi. Under this new grant, the EHDI-MS will work with the EHDI-AC to develop a number of action plans to implement improvement related to:

• **Expanded screening:** The EHDI-MS has two years to develop a plan to capture screening results for children screened from birth up to three years of age. These screenings should improve the identification of children with late onset hearing loss.

- Communication & Diversity Plans: This plan developed in the first year of the grant requires identifying meaningful communication strategies with families and providers and identifying populations/geographic areas/other variables of inequity to develop targeted strategies to engage diverse partners in the EHDI system.
- **Sustainability Plan:** This plan developed in the first year of the grant requires the identification of efforts to sustain the system after Federal funding ends.
- Early Childhood Engagement Plan: This plan developed in the first year of the
 grant requires the identification of efforts to engage early childhood partners in the
 system. Some of this work has already begun with Kim Ward serving on the early
 intervention/early childhood special education Comprehensive System of Personnel
 Development (CSPD) Strategic Planning Team (SPT), which is working on quality
 improvement and personnel standards as recommended by the JCIH.
- Family-to-Family & DHH Adult-to-Family Support: Under this grant, the EHDI-MS will support a new system for providing Family-to-Family and DHH-Adult-to-Family support to families by six months and nine months respectively. Unlike under the previous grant, these funds may be used directly by the program to hire consultants.
